I have watched Marcus and Hannah grow up via the photo cards they would send me. Debbie and Bill were a perfect team. He loved his wife, his son, his grand-children, and always the family dog more than anything. When I think of Bill Pennington, I think of a kind, loving man who just makes me smile to this day. I have always wanted to thank Chris for being born on that 18th day of August, so I could meet his parents and be just a small parts of their lives.
