Of her 2 children, Judy never hesitated to express her pride in both. She often talked of Neil's accomplishments as a naval officer and always expressed her delight with Robyn's incredible ability as a mother of 4 children; her precious

grandchildren which she spared no expense spoiling as only a loving grandmother could. Those 4 grandchildren were Judy's pride and joy. She loved to visit with each of them and have special 'Grammy Judy' time. She loved buying them books, taking them on vacations and giving that extra special gift they always wanted.
